

There was a lot of reading of articles and processing of the content. In addition, teachers wanted to have more assistance understanding what a quality goal looked like. The yoga example didn't have a well written goal according to the Student Growth Goal modules that were created previously and shared in the region. There needs to be more examples of quality goals, quality assessments, etc. The Rick Stiggins videos were appropriate and helpful except for the one that talked about stakeholders at least for our group. There was a participant in the audience that presented a negative vibe about teachers and principals and monopolized the conversation. The presenters had difficulty managing her. I think that there is a lot of good information, however, it needs to be very teacher friendly and demonstrates best practices for unwrapping the information. Talking with some administrators, we are wondering if more time needs to be spent on understanding how to create an assessment that is valid and reliable. That seemed to be a weak part of the learning. The protocol of numbering off and having all participants read the same content and then the participant that was #1, 2, 3, summarizing was not time effective and we found participants feeling that it bogged down the conversation. A jigsaw would probably be of better use, which was indicated.
